It is good to have the internet for entertainment and news.	It allows people to be tracked, especially by the CIA.

Language:	1 Bruh, Guys, Crazy, Dumb, Foolish, Dope, Cool, Skunked, and CHEFFED up.	These are great informal language features that I expect to see in your magazine article.
	2 Mobile devices are garbage, toxic and useless, and this generation is suffering from this addictive use of phones.	I have noted the use of exaggeration and probable bias, which are great elements of magazine articles.
